During their meeting on February 17, 2009, the members of the Chautauqua Lake Management Commission (CLMC) discussed three resolutions recently passed by the Board of Directors of the South and Center Chautauqua Lake Sewer Districts (SCCLSD) during their meeting of January 20, 2009. One of the three resolutions considered pertains to the Districts application for \$2,216,650 to replace a portion of the heavy-duty high precision rotating equipment at the treatment works (wastewater treatment plant).

The CLMC was presented information on the following points:

- The components to be replaced include seven clarifier drive reduction units, four surface turbine aerators, 2 re-aeration turbines, 2 comminutors, 2 screw lift pumps, and a chlorine mixer.
- The existing equipment has been in continuous service since 1980, far longer than the design useful life of 20-25 years.
- Since 2003, the Districts have incurred costs to date of \$602,841 for new replacement equipment, repair parts and services, and maintenance services, not including internal labor costs.
- This project does not require any NYSDEC permits or SEQRA clearances.
- The work involved in this project can be advertised for bids within 60 days of a funding commitment.
